# IMPORTANCE TO THE AFRICAN PEOPLE

Common activities: singing/dancing, ART Agriculture/Farming IN HARMONY with Nature

World Imperialism ENFORCES cheap labour & exploitation of environment

# COLONISATION / LIBERATION STRUGGLES

All of Africa COLONISED by Europe

PEOPLE waged liberation struggles to free themselves and regain their land

PEOPLE CONTINUE to fight EVEN under MOST EXTREME circumstances of exploitation

Neo-Colonialism continues to influence & undermine political, social and economic EMPOWERMENT of countries around the world POVERTY caused by NEO-

POVERTY caused by NEO-COLONIAL economic system of cooperation Neo-colonial System thru National Ruling Elite, Global/National Bourgeoisie DIVIDES WOMEN & UNDERMINES POOR WOMEN

 Neo-colonial exploitation thru' wars/military attacks against women & UNDERMINE women's dignity and their POLITICAL PARTICIPATION

Women continue to organise themselves to fight for their liberation

#### SITUATION OF WOMEN

- Unemployment RISING
- Lack of access to Education
- Reduced to cheap Labour
- Alcoholism, prostitution, dangerous health conditions (HIV/AIDS - >34 million cases in Africa), drug addiction, weapons & drug trafficking, homelessness; other dehumanizing situations
- Climate Change Environmental problems

### AFRICA WOMEN IN RURAL AREAS

- Unemployment leads to criminality in countryside
- Landlessness leads to dependence on big farmers – more exploitation& oppression
- Low political/class consciousness because of control of ruling elite in collaboration with global capitalists under an imperialist system that results in wars/military rule/actions

## Domestic Responsibilities

Time spent on housework & taking care of children: fetch water, collect firewood, cook, clean, wash, feed

During festivals, prepare meals for family & community

Caring for the young, sick and aged

## Patriarchal Family Structure

Man as head of household

Resources with male family members & decisions on resource distribution by men

Women' access to family resources based on their position as mothers & wives

Children bear father's family name

BUT

Generally, there is discussion & consensus within family on major decisions; women also take part

# Farming

Women farm on small land gets low yields for own sustenance

Dependent on big farms for small income (farm workers)

Climate Change: farming becomes difficult

# Income for Family

Earn Income to support family -

Formal Sector: Cleaner, Nurse, Laborer, Teacher, etc.

Informal Sector: Caterer, Tailor, Hawker, Retailer, Petty Trader, etc.

## Health & Reproduction

High Maternal/Infant Mortality Rate

Pre-& Post Natal Care - lack of medication, clinics & hospitals not well-equipped

Privatisation of Health Services deprive the poor from proper health care

High rate STDS, HIV/AIDS

Lack of Information on prevention & treatment of illnesses & diseases

Lack of information & access to contraception

#### Socio-cultural Discrimination

Women as source of problems, stigmatized as 'witches' & even killed

Women's work not seen as work & unpaid

Women's lack of control over our bodies: contraception, HIV/AIDS prevention

Domestication of women as wives & mothers

# ECONOMIC CRISIS/HOW IT AFFECTS?

Africa still underdeveloped

Industrial production affected; only few big industries: auto, steel, mining, agricultural by big companies

Employ & exploit local & foreign workers (farms/mining/ industries) under bad working conditions

# Africa needs development

## Poverty

Unemployment (men & women)

Irregular/Low Income e.g. farm produce

Lack of Capital, Information, Know-how e.g. to start own business

Lack of government support e.g. social welfare minimal

Lack of infrastructure e.g. irregular power support, no irrigation system

Petty Trade – low profit margin

### Lack of Education

High school drop-out rate:

Teenage Pregnancy (14, 15 years old) & Young Mothers

Parents/Teachers preference for boys in education

Girls & Young Women's role: domestic/marriage

## Lack of Economic Autonomy

Dependence on husband/partners

Childcare responsibilities

Lack of employment opportunities

Lack of resources/ control over resources

## WOMEN (& MEN) MIGRATION

Migration within Africa is high - not only to Europe & USA, nowadays also to Asia & Latin America

Families & Communities see migration as positive & a necessity

Lack of information & proper channels for safe, secure migration leads to human rights abuses e.g. human trafficking

Migration out of Africa is a drain of African resources (brain & human power)

**BUT** 

Migration also brings the needed foreign exchange that keep families & communities surviving

Stopping migration is not the solution

Ensuring migrants from Africa can travel, live & work safely with human rights & dignity is the solution
